Children return to school

This half-term's Geography highlights!

This term, Reception children are learning about their environment and roles in society. We were lucky enough to have fire fighters from Colne Fire Station visit us, with their fire engine, as well as a local police officer from the police station. Next, we created a small world area of our surroundings.







Year 1 have planned and completed two different walks around our school. They have been looking at physical and human features. They have made their own line maps and messy maps of our local area.





Year 2 have been locating countries and capital cities in the UK. We located Colne on a map and used a compass to give directions to each other. We then went on a walk around Colne to help us create a messy map!

We have also investigated how Waterside has changed over time by examining old photographs and historic maps of the area.










