'I learnt how to take care of the animals.'


'I learnt that on the farm icecream is made from gold top milk, British cream and sugar.'

Do not use a rapid lateral flow test when you have coronavirus symptoms. <u>Get a PCR test</u> and <u>self-isolate</u>.

You can also:

- find a pharmacy where you can collect tests
- find a local site to get tested at
- find a local site where you can collect tests
- get tests from your employer (if you cannot work from home)

When your child

has a positive lateral flow test result, it is essential that you book a PCR test for your child as soon as possible to confirm that the result is positive. Then inform school so we can decide if anyone needs to self-isolate.

When you or your child has symptoms, you and everyone you live with must immediately <u>self-isolate</u>. Do not leave home until you get your test results, except to post a test kit or for a PCR test appointment.

Remember to tell the school office when your child tests positive OR when your family has to self-isolate because of contact with someone who has tested positive.


